### **6. REVALIDATION**

#### **6.1 Application for Extension of Validation Period**

##### **6.1.1 CCT College Dublin**

The Committee NOTED the documentation circulated. CCT College Dublin requested a one-year extension of validation for the following programme:

The rationale for this request was as follows:

CCT College Dublin indicated that they wished to extend the duration of the programme for a further 12 months due to ongoing strategic discussions within the college's Executive Leadership Team regarding the scale of new business degree programmes being offered in the Dublin city area. It was their view that this additional extension would allow time for the market to stabilise and enable CCT College Dublin to make a considered decision as to the viability of the programme.

The Committee APPROVED the request to extend the last intake date of the programme above to August 2025.

NCI indicated that they wished to extend the duration of the above programmes by one year to allow time to strategically review all three programmes, which need to be carried out in partnership with the full P-Tech consortia. Additional time is also required to have improved alignment between the three programmes and the current development and validation of the proposed BA (Honours) Digital and Business Skills degree as a progression option for the P-Tech graduates on these programmes.

## **13. INTENTION TO WITHDRAW VALIDATION OF PROGRAMMES**

### **13.1 Intention to withdraw validation of programmes**

The Committee NOTED the documentation circulated. The Committee NOTED that the following CAS awards and their associated minor awards would be deactivated at the end of December 2023:

- Early Childhood Care and Education - 6M2007
- Early Childhood Care and Education - 5M2009

The executive informed all providers offering programmes leading to these awards that the associated programmes' validation would cease once the awards are deactivated.

In addition, two providers have confirmed that they are no longer offering Healthcare programmes. They have been informed that validation will be withdrawn.

The Committee NOTED the intention to withdraw validation of programmes.

## **14. SOLAS - UPDATE REPORT ON APPRENTICESHIP**

### **14.1 SOLAS - Update Report on Apprenticeship**

The Committee NOTED that SOLAS sent an update report to QQI on apprenticeship. The report indicated that:

- The current focus is on updating and developing the new curriculum and assessment for the five programmes recently revalidated. They are to be in place by Q1 2024.
- SOLAS has some significant staffing challenges. When resolved and new staff are in place, SOLAS will prioritise the implementation of the plan agreed with QQI.
- SOLAS is committed to the wider central reform agenda of a single integrated system.
- DFHERIS has asked SOLAS to prioritise the elimination of the backlog of training places at phase 2. A plan is now in place, led jointly by SOLAS and the National Apprenticeship Office (NAO). As this is a priority project for the Department and the Minister, it has been necessary to focus internal resources on this work.
- In addition to the above, SOLAS is continuing to co-ordinate, on a day-to-day basis, the operations of all 25 craft apprenticeship programmes including scheduling and administration; assessment development and delivery; results; certifications and engaging with apprentices (c22.5k) and employers of craft apprentices.

The QQI executive agreed to:

- Follow up with SOLAS to implement the plan as agreed, as it is imperative that apprentices entering programmes need to be assured that the programmes they are commencing are current and fit for purpose.
- Advise the DFHERIS re QQI's concerns relating to the validation status/fitness of the craft apprenticeship programmes (to meet industry's and learners needs) including that previous validated programmes were never implemented.

## **15. REENGAGEMENT PROCESS: PROVIDER AND PANEL MEMBER SURVEY**

### **15.1 Reengagement Process: Provider Survey**

The Committee NOTED the Reengagement Process: Provider Survey which was circulated in advance of the meeting.

In September 2023, QQI issued a survey to 134 providers that had been evaluated through a QA approval process (reengagement, initial access to validation or extension of scope of provision to include blended learning or FET to HET).

The purpose of the survey was to gather feedback on how to improve the QA approval processes for panels and providers going forward. The survey form asked the provider to rate a number of substantive statements using a 5-point scale going from 5 Strongly Agree to 1 Strongly Disagree. The provider was also invited to suggest how their experience in the area could be improved.

The information will be used within QQI as part of its quality improvement process.

The response rate was 46% - 62/134 providers responded.

While most providers welcomed the level of documentation and information available, a number of smaller FET providers expressed concern in relation to the significant amount of documentation and information and would prefer if there were more summarised documents or templates available.

Overall, providers agreed that access to advice and feedback from QQI staff was invaluable in assisting with the application process.

Overall, providers agreed that the composition of the panel was appropriate and, while acknowledging the challenges posed by the reengagement process, it reflects the underpinning principles of value, context and proportionality, fairness and consistency, and confidentiality.

### **15.2 Reengagement Process: Panel Member Survey**

The Committee NOTED the Reengagement Process: Panel Member Survey which was circulated in advance of the meeting.

In September 2023, QQI issued a survey to 96 panel members who had participated on a QA approval panel (reengagement, initial access to validation or extension of scope of provision to include blended learning or FET to HET) since the last such survey was issued in late 2020.

The purpose of the survey was to gather feedback on how to improve the QA approval processes for panels and providers going forward. The survey form asked the panel member to rate a number of substantive statements using a 5-point scale going from 5 Strongly Agree to 1 Strongly Disagree. The panel member was also invited to suggest how their experience in the area could be improved.

The information will be used within the QA Approval unit as part of its quality improvement process.

The response rate was 57% - 55/96 responded.

While acknowledging that the reengagement process is challenging for smaller FET providers, panel members agreed overall that the process facilitates evaluation relevant and proportionate to provider context and scale.

All panel members agreed that access to advice and feedback from QQI staff was invaluable in assisting with the evaluation process.

Of those panel members who provided qualitative feedback in relation to the virtual context of the evaluation, while recognising the benefits of the online platform, there is an appetite to return to in-person site visits.
